Kitchen	Bathroom	Living Room/Bedroom	Hallways
<p>Clean all kitchen appliances including the oven, microwave, fridge, and dishwasher.</p>	<p>Scrub and disinfect the toilet, sink, and bathtub/shower,</p>	<p>Dust and wipe down all surfaces, including skirting boards.</p>	<p>Wipe down doors, handles, and light switches. Be sure to wet-dust these surfaces to remove as much dust as possible.</p>
<p>Extractor fans and the hob. Use a strong hob cleaner to get the best results.</p>	<p>Descalc Shower and Taps, making sure to attend to the shower head.</p>	<p>Vacuum carpets or mop floors where necessary. Address any stains with a good stain remover.</p>	<p>Dust and clean any shelving or built-in storage. These are areas that commonly get overlooked, and dust builds up quickly.</p>
<p>Wipe down all countertops and cabinets, both inside and out.</p>	<p>Remove any smudges, stains or fingerprints from mirrors and bathroom tiles.</p>	<p>Clean windows, blinds, and curtains. You may need to steam clean your curtains, so allow time for this.</p>	<p>Vacuum and mop floors. If stains are present, use a good carpet stain remover after vacuuming.</p>
<p>Scrub the sink and taps, paying attention to the drains as well.</p>	<p>Remove dust from towel rails and other handles.</p>	<p>Remove any markings on the wall, if permitted.</p>	
<p>Mop the floors, vacuum where necessary and finally empty the bins.</p>	<p>Wipe down any extractor fans, removing dust and grime.</p>	<p>Ensure furniture is clean, dust-free and in the correct place.</p>	
	<p>Empty bins and mop floors. Consider sanitising bins if necessary.</p>
